Observations


The figures below are based on the returns submitted by our accredited organisations for the period August 2018 – July 2019. Understandably, information varies between organisations: some will have different emphases, for example a focus on apprenticeships rather than traditional work experience; they will be organisations of different sizes and type (Employer, Learning/Training Provider or Facilitator); and they operate in a wide range of different industry sectors segments.

A consensus and overall picture do emerge though, and they're of continuing excellent work and commitment by all our accredited organisations. The significant year-on-year increases (e.g. on numbers of learners, achievement of qualifications and progression to further education) reflect the increasing number of NHS Trusts accredited with us, as they deal in big numbers, and the growing number of facilitators seeking and achieving Fair Train accreditation.


